












OWNER SPOTLIGHT

Dear Friends,

Bob the birder here! Lucky you who are enjoying leisure time over these next three months. You may be sad that the snow is melting and the skiing will be on pause for a bit But, we are coming into the best three months of the birding year. Spring Migration.

Spring Migration

Spring Migration is the time of year when millions of birds travel north from their wintering grounds in the southern U.S., Central America, and beyond to breed in the northern forests, wetlands, and coastlines. This migration peaks from Late April through early June, bringing a surge of colorful songbirds, shorebirds and raptors right through the White Mountains and nearby shores of New Hampshire.

Some birds stay and breed in New Hampshire but many are just passing through on their long journey to northern breeding territories where food is abundant and nesting competition is lower.

TOOLS FOR BIRDING

In my last newsletter, I promised you that I would share some of the tools I use for locating, identifying, counting and keeping records on the birds I find.

There are many so I will explain two of them here and in my next newsletter explain a few more.

1) E-BIRD APP


First, I recommend that you download the free "E-bird" app onto your phone. This app serves as an interface with the Cornell University database. Imagine half a million people reporting the birds they see on a daily basis into a database that is tracking birds' movements. Cornell can use this data to map bird migration, study the effects of climate changes, changes in food supply, water availability, etc. E-bird will also serve as a perfect record keeper for what you find.

To use the app you simply download it, open it, select "Start Checklist", and enter your location from a drop-down menu. Every possible bird for the region you are in is on a list. Just select them as you see them and enter the number of birds of that one specie you are seeing.

2) MERLIN APP

The second app which I find to be useful is the Merlin app. This app is also supported by Cornell and it allows you to identify birds that you see by their sound or by a photo if you can capture one. You simply open the app and hit the "sound" button. I caution that this app isn't perfect. It is maybe 80% accurate? If the app "hears" a particular bird, you should consider that a clue for the bird you are trying to find.

BIRDING HOTSPOTS



When I last wrote, I told you about Quincy Bog in Rumney, and Pondicherry Wildlife Refuge in Jefferson/Whitefield. I encourage you to visit them.

Before closing I would like to suggest a few other birding "Hotspots", as well.

When traveling to Waterville Valley from points south you might consider "birding" Odiorne Point State Park in Rye, NH. On my way home to Massachusetts from the Inns last October, I stopped by there. I identified 18 species. In the spring time however, I could imagine many more being present.

Two other Hotspots that I had success at were <u>Chaffee Wildlife</u>
<u>Sanctuary in Grafton, NH</u> (20 species noted), and (because I wanted to say that I birded in Vermont), <u>North Thetford Landing in Orange, Vermont</u>. It is so beautiful there along the river and I noted 19 species of birds. A wonderful day-trip from the Inns.


So, get outside! Wander around hike and picnic with binoculars around your neck and your Merlin and E-bird apps
